

12/9 cotton warp & hand dyed wool weft


Weft 3 ends of 2/65 Rug wool ends for mixing colors)

The green is the indigo overdyed with weld.





# Skein of yarn dyed with natural dye extracts

The process is extremely simple: you put the fabric or yarn in a shallow pan, pour the dye extracts on randomly, add a little water to prevent scorching (ask me how i know)and simmer for 45 minutes.

The yarn was previously mordanted with alum. I am warping the little loom with the same yarn

Originally created in the early 1980's with Crompton Mill Velveteen Completed in 1982

The piece was dirty, the black velveteen was dry rotted and ripping

Refurbished into a comforter cover

Each square was had washed With Fibre Wash



After washing with yellowing reduced



Yellowing before washing

## Linda Edquist

Each square lined with polyester Crepeline fabric for stabilization



New black cotton velveteen from Fabrics.Com to piece the squares

With comforter backing a cotton extra wide fabric also from the same source
