#### EWG 2019 Annual Fiber Arts Celebration and \*\*Holiday Sale Recap\*\*

This year the Celebration and Sale was especially successful! 290 people found ETC's new location and came through the door - more than last year. The sale brought in **\$9,816**, most of which went to members who sold their items. This amount included \$508 from the sale of the bread cloths and runners. Linda Borntrager, who wove all 10 of the bread cloths, deserves special recognition for that feat. So do John Morse, Beki Ries-Montgomery, Krista Richey, Karen Sieradski, Janet Kalstrom and Diane Pigg, who wove the 6 runners. Finally, special thanks to Jeanne Remiro who did the finishing on all of them. Our raffle brought in \$2,060 which was divided between Egan Warming Center and Cafe 60/Meals on Wheels. The Natural Dye and Ethnic Textile Study Group created two amazing table sets for the raffle. Both charities have expressed their gratitude for our support. And, coincidentally, the winners of the table sets were former member Jackie Robertson and current member J'nene Wade! Many people enjoyed watching the demonstrations; the refreshments were tasty and the daily prizes provided excitement! November Program Review: Annin Barrett Timberline Lodge Textiles

Annin started working on the documentation, restoration and recreation of the handwoven textiles at the Timberline Lodge in 1975. The lodge, on the south side of Mt. Hood, was constructed between 1936 and 1938 as a Works Progress Administration (WPA) project. Hundreds of local builders and artisans built the lodge and made the furnishings, including textiles for upholstery, draperies, bedding and rugs. Over the years, many of the textiles wore out, due to use and

neglect, or were removed to be replaced with newer things. In 1975 the *Friends of Timberline* was founded to preserve the original art and artifacts made for the lodge. Annin Barrett was one of four weavers employed to recreate some of the original textiles. Since then more than 4000 yards of hand-woven fabric and 100 hand hooked rugs have been produced. Annin described the original textile works, noting the lack of physical records documenting them, and told many anecdotes about the process of bringing the textile history of the lodge back into public focus.

# Highlights of the January 6, 2020 EWG Board Meeting

- Sarah Mostkoff and Charlene Virts (*Central Oregon Spinners and Weavers*) are the joint chairs of the WeGO travelling show which will be exhibited in Eugene in 2023. The committee includes Marilyn Robert and Sue Donaldson.
- Barbara Pickett attended the meeting to give us additional guidance on the proposed criteria and management of a scholarship fund.
- Emily presented an analysis of our dues income. Board members discussed options for how to increase timely dues payment.
- Board members discussed how to manage our savings account funds, which amount to approximately \$9000.
- The Board recommended purchasing another bookcase to maximize our storage space at ETC.

• The Board recommended restoring the Library fund to the original \$500. Approximately \$200 of the budgeted \$500 was used to purchase a new bookcase prior to our move.

#### **STUDY GROUPS**

#### Natural Dye and Ethnic Textile Study Group

This group is dedicated to the use of natural dyes on natural fibers suitable for weaving, with an emphasis on locally available, organic, and sustainable dyestuffs. Our explorations include dyeing on yarn and cloth and traditional ethnic dye techniques of shibori, ikat, and katazome. Meeting times vary and attendance in this study group is limited by the size of the dye studio.. It usually meets on the third Friday at a private dye studio. Current projects include growing indigo, sponsoring a dye garden at the Extension Center, color experiments, and garment construction. In July the study group visited Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art. The curator of Asian textiles selected a group of traditional Japanese naturally dyed textiles for the dye group to study and appreciate. Contact Diane Pigg (tdpigg@yahoo.com) for more information.

#### Fiber Challenge Study Group

The Fiber Challenge Study Group is inclusive of all fiber arts, including weaving, braiding, dyeing and printing, felting, sewing and stitching, spinning, knitting, crochet, macrame, and book and paper making. At the beginning of each calendar year we choose a new topic to address in any of these techniques. During meetings we share both our work and research on the topic, as well as any other work that we have been doing. During 2020 our dual topic will be, (1) recycling, upcycling, mixed media and (2) more than one layer to create a 3-dimensional object. #### Weave Structures Study Group (WSSG)

WSSG is a learning community devoted to broadening the understanding of weave structures through education, practice, and group sharing. The group's current focus is on Rep Weave, but we are in the process of transitioning to doubleweave. We meet at ETC at 10am on the first Saturday of every month to allow those unable to attend the regular Monday Guild meetings to participate in guild activities. #### Scandinavian Weaves Study Group (SCAN)

This group studies the weaving traditions of the Scandinavian countries -Denmark, Iceland, Norway, and Sweden - their neighbor Finland, and the Sami, the indigenous peoples of northern Scandinavia and Russia. Members explore, and share what they learn, about Scandinavian weaving techniques and structures. Weave structures include Finn weave (doubleweave pickup), Jamtlandsvav (crackle), Krokbragd, and Ripsmatta (rep weave). Besides jack and countermarche looms, members weave with Bandgrind (rigid heddle looms) and twine with cards. We meet at ETC at 10:30 on the second Thursday of the month. #### Inkle Weaving Study Group
