MEF's are available to RVHG members of 1 year or more who have not received an MEF award for at least 4 years. Qualifying activities must take place between June, 2018 and June, 2019. Award amounts are a max. \$100.00 for an in-state activity, or a max of \$200. for an out-of-state or overnight activity. Awards will be made at the December RVHG meeting.

- Welcome: Nadine Purcell brought the meeting to order and welcomed everyone and asked about new members. Thank you to Carol Kowalke and Cathy Hamm for bringing the refreshments to our meeting. Nadine introduced and welcomed Sara Hopkins Powell, former member and president of our guild.
- <u>Cross Country Weavers Notebook:</u> Kamie Liston reported that we have received this
 year's notebook from the Cross-Country Weavers. The Theme for this year is "Colors
 of The World".
- Approval of Minutes: The minutes were approved as written for the October 9, 2018 meeting.
- <u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Leanne Krieger reported the Treasurer's Report: October 1 thru October 31, 2018. Balance on hand on Oct. 1, 2018: \$3,310.57. Income: \$432.00. Total expenses: \$1732.00. Balance on hand as of Oct. 31, 2018, \$2,010.57. Savings: Balance on hand on Oct. 1, 2018, \$3,372.48. Balance on hand Oct. 31,2018, \$5,311.07. Net Worth as of Oct. 31, 2018: \$2,933.69.
- Outreach: Jeanette reported that we will continue to have a spot in the library at the Talent Harvest Festival and they will be adding our guild to their advertising for this event.

- Member Education Fund: Leanne reported that we have \$600.00 to give away in this
 fund for furthering members education. If interested in receiving any of the funds you
 need to submit your application and give it to Nadine before the drawing which will be
 held at the December meeting.
- WeGo: * Betsy Brauer has ended her term in WeGo. Thank you for all you have done. *The WeGo website has been completely revamped. There is no longer a member only section; everything is available. Here is the website: wegooregon.org. *WeGo is not sponsoring a program in 2019, but has plans for a 2020 workshop in Rigid Heddle and Saori. *WeGo is actively planning for the 2021 ANWG and WeGo conference which will be held at the Willamette University in Salem, June 7-13, 2021, there will be a traveling show in 2023. *The "Color Gone Wild "shows last stop is in Salem.
- ANWG: Next ANWG conference will be June 11-16, 2019 at Prince George, Canada. Registration opens up in January 2019. The Challenge is "Imagine a Pocket and What it Might Contain." *Lisa Krebs needs more items for the library displays including some samples from the Robyn Spady class. *The display schedule is as follows: Central Point Library: December 4, 2018.
