

June - Challenge presentations & guild potluck. Hostess Kathy Brooks.

SHG Challenge

Working with Color - Choose colors you like, add another color that you don't usually weave with and see what happens.

Make a <u>warp</u> with 3-4 colors that you love, varying the hue, tint or shade (pure color, pastel, or darkened color). Add a thread, a stripe, or a section of a complimentary or split complimentary color somewhere in the warp (but not too close to the selvedge).

For the weft experiment, make sections of these:

- 1) 3-4 favorites
- 2) added complimentary thread color
- 3) white
- 4) black

You will have 4-8 samples on your warp. Choose whatever you like the most and make a scarf, towels, table runner, whatever you choose. (you could also put a towel warp on and have the towels be the result of your experiments).

Whatever you do, have fun with the "what if I put ..." of color combinations!

Saturday Handweavers Guild Notes in Lieu of Minutes for April 2020

Hello Saturday Guild members: Since we did not meet in April, I have compiled these notes from items sent to me by Board members and others. -KM

Treasurer's Report (Kathy Fennell):

Previous Checking Account Balance: \$4253.19.

Current Checking Account Balance: \$4,290.78 which includes Joann Hall workshop deposits of \$1375 (11 x \$125).

Income received: \$3,293.51. This included 20 cents of checking account interest, Daryl Lancaster workshop balance payments of \$1550 and member dues from two nonmembers who took the workshop of \$40 (one paid the prorated rate of \$15, the other chose to pay the non-prorated rate of \$25). Halcyon Yarns Rewards program recalculated our guild expenditures last year and sent an additional rewards check for \$21.31. Finally, a deposit was made of \$1682, which included one balance payment of \$307 from the Daryl Lancaster workshop and 11 deposits of \$125 each for the JoAnn Hall workshop scheduled for October.

Expenses: \$3255.92. This included \$3,103 for Daryl Lancaster's workshop and materials fee and \$152.92 reimbursement for Deb Keberle's workshop coordinator expenses. Current Savings Account Balance: unchanged at \$2,838.73.

Grand Total all funds: \$7,129.51, which includes the workshop deposits mentioned earlier of \$1375.

Library Fund Balance: \$288.63

Scholarship Fund Account Balance: \$250

Old Business

Workshops (Deb Keberle.): There are 14 spaces filled for the Swedish Art Weaves workshop with Joanne Hall 16-18 October 2020. There are currently 6 spaces open. The deposit due is \$125. The total cost has gone down to a new price range of \$175-\$200. If you want to join this workshop, send a deposit to Kathy Fennell 1738 Dragon Tail Place Medford 97504 ASAP.

More information about the Joanne Hall workshop: Deb received a note from Joanne that had some useful information that she wanted to pass along. The October workshop requires a 4-shaft loom, 12-inch weaving width, 10-dent reed and 112 heddles. She also requests that looms have at least a 24-inch loom depth (breast beam to back beam). She said that she just got back from Florida and there were some very small table looms, which do not give enough space for comfortable weaving of the techniques.

Deb is also happy to announce that she is taking names for the **Ikat Warp and Weft** workshop taught by Marilyn Roberts. The workshop is 4 days long and will be held over the Memorial Day weekend, Friday thru Monday, 28-31, May 2021. The cost for this workshop will be approximately \$300.00 if full. The price will adjust dependent on the number of people that sign-up and whether we get a scholarship from ANWG. This class has limited number of people that may attend, only 9 people. We will be dyeing (Kasuri) and weaving Ikat both warp and weft. The instructor will supply the warp. Folks will be very busy with this workshop with little downtime—so if you're ready for an intense 4-day learning and exploration of Ikat let Deb know and she'll place you on the sign-up list. You can drop her a line at debfred83@gmail.com. Deposits for this workshop will be \$125.00 due at the October guild meeting.

I finished the dyed cotton scarf. 20 epi, overshot star shape (from Robyn's workshop handbook). I learned that I have to be more careful about not advancing the warp too far, and getting the fell line too close to the breast beam, because it shows as an irregular beat!
