ANWG Conference in June. Oregon was a major grower of flax and processor of linen in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. One poster



gave a synopsis of Nancy Hoskin's research into this industry. Another poster contained a pictorial record of Krista Richey's journey into growing her own flax and then turning it into linen yarn. And a third poster told the story of Tracy



Livernois' efforts to process, spin, and weave with flax. The Weave Structure Study Group provided the textiles displayed in the booth. They were all woven with linen or cottolin. Both posters and textiles were displayed at ETC as the July Show for our 75th Anniversary Celebration.

It could be a painless entry into sales at best or at worst a fun weekend out with the girls.
